



The Epiphany of The Lord - January 4, 2026



Dear Brothers and Sisters of the Four Pillars in Faith ACC,

It is once again time for the semi-annual update from the pastoral council chairperson. The majority of the council's time over the past six months has been spent discussing two main topics. The first topic was the All Things New process. The council received updates as to how the process was going and offered feedback to Father Timothy based on comments and discussions council members had had with parishioners. I would like to personally thank the parishioners who volunteered to serve on the All Things New Committee. It was an intense process that demanded a great deal of time over the past nine months and the pastoral council is grateful that you were open to God's call to serve the ACC in this capacity.

The second topic of discussion was based on results from the parishioner survey conducted in early 2025. This topic was how to build community within the ACC. We talked about current efforts as well as potential future efforts. However, like many of you, our discussions struggled to gain traction as we wondered what the future of the ACC was going to look like. In November, we found out that the future likely involves the loss of two of our parishes.

The original plan for this column was to discuss how we should look for opportunities to build community, but it now seems appropriate to use this space to recognize that our ACC is grieving the upcoming loss (barring any significant changes) of two of our parishes. We humans generally do not do change very well, and many of us have significant memories at the church buildings in Foreston and Ogilvie. Funerals, weddings, First Communions, bazaars, luncheons, and the list goes on. Losing the tangible object where these memories occurred is much like losing a loved one. There will be a grieving process, and as Christians, we should support each other through this process. We should remember that everybody grieves differently. We also should remember that our memories will live on and can continue to bring us joy even though our loved one, or in this case a building, is gone.

I pondered this a great deal as I sat in my deer stand the last weekend of deer season. I looked out on a woods that was about to change. It will be logged off this winter and I will never see it the same again. A part of me was very sad as I thought about all the memories I had made with my grandfather in those woods. I soon realized however, that those woods were always changing. Trees that were there twenty years ago are now rotting on the ground, but my memory of the missed buck has never gone away. The logging job, while painful, will create new opportunities to make new memories with my kids as we chase deer under different trees. I trust that God will also offer new opportunities for all of us to make memories and grow in our faith in the new version of our ACC, just as he did in the old one. As always, please pray for the pastoral council.
